Sum 1 & 2	<p><b>By the end of this unit all pupils should know:</b> Unit 5: What do Jewish people believe about God and the Covenant?</p> <p>To know some information about Rosh Hashanah, the beginning of the Jewish New year</p> <p>To know about Yom Kippur (the end of 10 days of fasting)</p> <p>Know that Jews believe in one G-d who created the universe.</p> <p>Know basic elements of the story found in Genesis:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-G-d made the world from nothing</li> <li>-G-d Makes everything in the world, including plants and animals</li> <li>-Man is the last to be made</li> <li>-Man is made last and is given responsibility to care for the world G-d has created</li> </ul> <p>Know that Jews have coming of age ceremonies: Bar and Bat Mitzvah (for boys and girls, respectively)</p> <p>Know that Jews believe in one God who created the universe.</p> <p>Be able to recognise the Star of David as a symbol of Judaism, which represents the 6 days of creation found in Genesis.</p> <p>Know that the Jewish name for God is Adonai which mean 'Lord'. Jews use the name with great respect, never carelessly. Sometimes Jews write the words as God because of its sacredness.</p> <p>Know that Jews live all over the world, but Israel is considered very special as it was promised to Abraham and his descendants by God.</p>	<p>forgiveness, pardon, atonement, Rosh Hashannah, Yom Kippur, shofar. Year 2 Unit 6: What do Jewish people believe about Torah?	Aut 1 & some Aut 2	<p><b>By the end of this unit all pupils should know:</b> Unit 6: What do Jewish people believe about Torah?</p> <p>Know that the Torah means 'teaching' is the most important part of Jewish scriptures.</p> <p>Know that it contains the first 5 books of the Hebrew Bible.</p> <p>To know it teaches Jews what God is like and how they should live their lives.</p> <p>To know that one day a week Jews observe the Sabbath: they rest, have a meal on Friday evening with their family. Jews believe that bringing the family together once a week when no one works is important.</p>	<p>Law; Torah; Moses, Simchat Torah, Challah, kippah, tallit. yad Torah scroll. Chupah, ketubah, mazel tov.</p>
Year 3 Torah	Spri 1	<p><b>By the end of this unit all pupils should know:</b> Torah</p> <p>To know that on the Shabbat Jews attend the synagogue, where they worship G-d. Doing this develops a sense of community.</p> <p>To know that the reading of the Torah is central to the service: during the service there will be readings from the Torah.</p> <p>Know the Torah is written in Hebrew.</p> <p>To know that Jewish scriptures are called the Tenakh, which are made up of 3 sections: Torah, Nevi'ism and Ketuvim. The word Tenakh, is made up of these 3 types of writing.</p>	<p>kippah, tallit, yad Torah scroll. Tanakh, Torah, Navi, Ketuvim, Talmud, Mishnah.</p>

Year 4 God and the Covenant	Spri 1	<p><b>By the end of this unit all pupils should know:</b> God and the Covenant          To know that G-d first made his covenant agreement with Abraham.          To know that G-d promises he would be the father of a great nation, the Jewish people, who will live in the land of Canaan.          Know that Jews celebrate the exodus at the week-long Passover festival; at the Seder meal Jews re-tell the story of the Exodus using symbolic food. The festival recalls this as a key event in their history because it shows: (a) God was at work in the events of history (b) they have been chosen to have a special relationship with God.</p>	<p>Passover, Covenant, Sedar, Matzah, Pesah, Passover. Western (Wailing) wall, Temple Mount, Jerusalem, Israel.</p>

Know that Abraham is called one of the fathers of Judaism          Know the story of Abraham who Jews believe was the first person to believe in one God:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Abraham was rich and lived in Ur; the people worshipped many gods</li> <li>• God speaks to Abraham and tells him to leave his home with 3 promises: a relationship with God, numerous descendants and land</li> <li>• but Sara is barren</li> <li>• with no scriptures or traditions, he puts his faith in God</li> </ul> <p>Know that Yom Kippur is the holiest day in the Jewish calendar.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• This period starts with Rosh Hashannah and ends ten days later with Yom Kippur. It is during this time of fasting that Jews show how sorry they are, and attend the synagogue as often as they can, listening to the Torah; for asking for forgiveness from those who they have wronged, forgive those who have wronged them and ask G-d to forgive them; saying, "And for all these, God of forgiveness, forgive us, pardon us, and grant us atonement"</li> </ul> <p>Know that the Torah is the most important because it tells Jews what God is like and how they should live.
