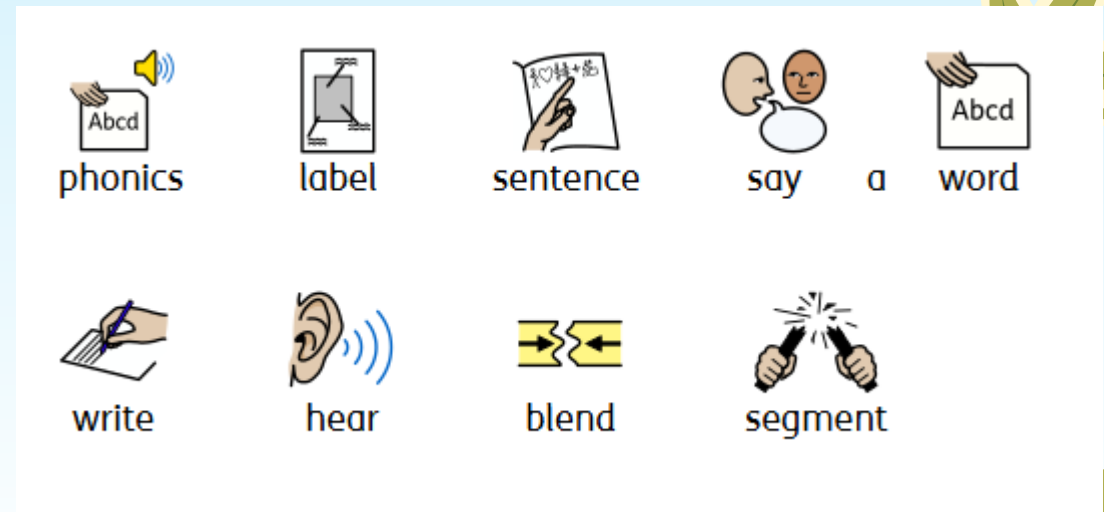
# English

**READING BOOKS** - We will continue to send home two reading books a week. As a school we expect the children to be reading at least four times a week. Your child's book can be handed in on a Thursday or Friday each week and will be returned to them on a Friday.

We will also send home information and tips on how to support your child with learning to read. If your child has read his/her reading book, please sign and date the reading record. Books should be placed in the container (will be next to book bags) on a Thursday or Friday morning.

### Ways to support children at home:

- Read stories and discuss new words talk about what they mean. Talk about the story/characters/setting.
- Talk to your children about traditions your family may have and which events your family celebrate and why (think about Christmas, birthdays, Diwali, bar/bat mitzvahs etc.)
- Count, Count, Count!
- Play 'Fishy, Fishy fingers'.
- Ask the children to hunt for certain objects at home but instead of saying the word sound it out e.g. c-a-t. The children then need to work out what you have said and go and get it.
- Go for a hunt for objects that start with a specific sound.
- Practice your letters and sounds which come home in your phonic folder. (More information to follow)
- Find the numbers 1-5 in the environment on your travels.

### WOW Words (Subject Specific Vocabulary):

- Friendship - Being kind and having fun with others.
- Feelings and emotions - Happy, excited, frightened, angry, sad, upset, shy etc.
- Festival of Light - Another name for Diwali
- India - A country in Asia
- Hindus - People that follow the religion Hinduism.
- Bonfire Night - A celebration observed on 5 November in the UK.
- Bethlehem - A town where Jesus was born.
- Christmas - A festival celebrated by Christians on December 25th
- Christian - A person that follows the religion of Christianity.
- Nativity - A re-enactment of when Jesus was born
- Jesus Christ - Son of God.
- Winter - A season, in which the days are cold and short.
- Antarctica - The coldest place on Earth, which is covered in ice.
