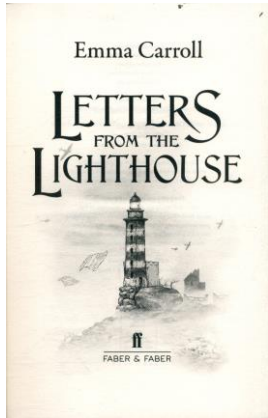

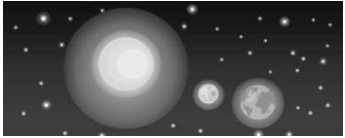

Design Technology

Textiles: Design and make a hanging decoration



What will I learn?

- What to include in my design a hanging decoration
- How to use blanket **stitch** to join two pieces of fabric
- Use appliqué or decorative stitching to decorate the front of their stuffed toy.
- Identify what worked well and areas for improvement
- Blanket stitch is useful to reinforce the edges of a fabric material or join two pieces of fabric.
- Small, neat stitches which are pulled taut are important to ensure that the soft toy is strong and holds the stuffing securely.
